METHODOLOGY:

The sample size for the survey is 665 active voters ages 55 and older taken from a listed sample of registered voters who voted in the 2010 or 2012 general election or registered since the 2012 general election. The margin of error is +/- 4.0%. 665 interviews were completed using automated telephone technology. All interviews were conducted on September 7, 2014 by Vox Populi Polling. The total percentages for responses may not equal 100% due to rounding.
